Committee Reports

CJIC Update Jeremy Ludwig

If you and your LASOs have not reviewed the latest policy 5.9.5, please make sure you are doing so. There are some impacting updates to include MFA, encryption and ID proofing. There is a companion document that outlines the priority items.

Their correspondence should include their announcement that they will begin auditing to LMR encryption requirements 10-1-26. This does not mean you have to be in full compliance by then. It does mean they will site it as a finding, and it will go through the standard sanctions process. If you have a plan and are taking steps to meet that plan, you will be good.

From Kevin Collins via the CJIS Board Meeting Directly:

Radio Encryption

- A guidance paper has been written and is currently under review to be provided to agencies for awareness regarding the dissemination of Criminal Justice Information (CJI) over the radio and the new encryption standards. Discussions have been had and they are waiting on further input from others before finalizing.
- Agencies continue to be concerned about the October 1, 2026, auditing date. Although the policy is already in effect and technically agencies should be currently compliant, the MSP CJIS Compliance Unit is allowing time to plan for it and educate people. When agencies are audited in the next 3-year cycle, that's when a non-compliance finding in Michigan would run through the sanctions policy (5-step process). If agencies are being responsive and showing progress, they will generally not move to the next level of the sanctions policy.

State 911 Office Report

MiSNAP:

The next set of enhancements for MiSNAP will be live December 6, 2024. As a reminder, some of those updates included reducing the number of approval signatures needed on the training fund application and the inability to submit an application after the deadline. The training manual has been updated and Lyndsay will put an updated recording in the resources section to help those needing assistance with the application process.

GIS Repository:

Several efforts have been made by the State 911 Office and the Center for Shared Solutions GIS team to get all counties to upload their data into the repository. An updated map was added to the SNC website at the end of October. A workgroup was put together with members from the ETS to update the MOU for the repository.

There is a link on the SNC website for the Michigan Statewide NG911 GIS Repository. This is a great resource with previously recorded training that has been provided along with information about how to contact the NG911 Repository help desk.

Other Activity of the State 911 Office:

- NENA is still in the process of adopting the 911/988 standard. It just went through the third round of public comment as of November 20, the final document is ready to move to DSC approval for publication. Once published, 988 will be reaching out to PSAPs to discuss and work on a MOA.
- The NASNA Outage Workgroup which includes the Executive Directors of National APCO and NENA continues to work together to develop an outage reporting solution that will meet the needs of both the PSAP/ECC community and the communications providers. They try to meet bimonthly until a proposed solution is developed.
- The Compliance Review Specialist vacancy is reposted at an analyst level. The posting will be open until December 17.
- As a reminder, 2022 training funds need to be spent by December 31, 2024, to qualify for 2025 funding. If your agency needs an invoice, it must be requested by December 21 and paid by December 31, 2024, in order to qualify.
- The annual 911 Technology Forum will be held at the Kensington Hotel in Ann Arbor, September 15-17, 2025. Call for Papers will be going out in January if you are interested in presenting.
- As a reminder, our office will be closed on Christmas Eve and Christmas day as well as New Year's Eve and New Year's Day.

SLCGP Update:

- The Planning Committee is currently working through the process of awarding FY22 funds and project ideas for FY23. The current FY23 application period will close December 30. The workgroup will be scheduling a meeting with the scoring subcommittee to review and establish the scoring process for applications that will begin in January 2025.
- PSAPs/public safety agencies are highly encouraged to sign up to receive grant updates from the bottom of the page here. This will help to keep you informed in the future of upcoming grant funding opportunities and instructions on how to participate.
