Mr. Farrer stated that the FCC is looking at statewide licenses for secondary buildouts; the rules state that 2/3 of area or population is sufficient, but the FCC is stating that all the first channels need to be used. Mr. Farrer states that the rules are not explicit on this point, and is states are forced to return channels it will complicate coordination at state lines.

Mr. Farrer was asked if the addition of utilities creates grade of service issues. He explained that this is not true, because the addition of DTE, Consumers, ITC, and SEMCO brought 800 MHz business frequencies, which can be used by public safety, but that the utilities cannot use the 700 MHz channels.

Mr. Hutchinson discussed the burning of several towers in Kent County.
